Protect your plants with bark mulch

Mulch is essential in a dry climate area as in Colorado. Mulching minimizes evaporation from the soil surface, holding in much needed moisture for healthy roots. This is particularly important in a new garden or landscape where there is a lot of space between plants. Mulch also reduces weed growth and helps control erosion.

Mulch helps protect roots in freezing weather and keeps soil temperatures low in the heat of the summer. Mulch protects plant roots from getting overheated, and it reduces transpiration. Transpiration is “perspiration for plants,” the water plants lose through their leaves from heat.

For perennial and annual beds, The Landscape Center highly recommends Soil Pep. It is a very fine ground bark that gives your garden a finished look and makes the colors really pop!
